## No Swimming at Algonac Boat Ramp

A boat ramp is not the right place to go swimming — it's not safe. Swimming in areas where boats are operating is extremely dangerous and can result in death or serious injuries. Most boats are powered by propellers which are sharp and spin at high speed, and swimmers in the water are sometimes very difficult for boat operators to see. Boat propeller injuries, if not fatal, are always serious.

The pool project is out for bids! The 1957 pool at Lions Field was closed in 2020 due to water loss and safety concerns and needs to be replaced. Bids are due end of May.

## Please Remove Sandbags

Property owners are requested to remove sandbags that were placed along shorelines in 2020, when high water threatened lakeside properties. At that time the sandbags helped owners prevent erosion to their property and structures. Now that the water level has fallen, EGLE is instructing residents to remove sandbags, as deteriorating sandbags could leave plastic pollution in the water and on the shoreline.
